JCPC Member Spotlight

Evelyn Tobey

A longtime member of the congregation at John Calvin, Evelyn Tobey first came to our church in 1976. She grew up in New Orleans and was a member of Gentilly Presbyterian Church. Evelyn met her husband at LSU and they married shortly after graduation. After graduation, the Tobeys lived in Georgia where Evelyn taught junior high math then moved to Texas where she taught in high school until their first child was born. "I have always been involved in volunteering-- in church, with educational institutions and philanthropic groups," Evelyn says of her passion for using her talents to help others.

PROJECT REGENERATION MISSION STUDY 2024

In late January of this year, John Calvin embarked on a mission to answer two questions: Who are we? What is God calling us to do? After months and days of praying, we are still trying to figure it all out. The departure of Rev. Aaron left us feeling like sheep without a shepherd, but the leaders of JCPC held strong to the hope that we will once again overcome.

At the June 17, 2024 Session meeting, Chris Currie (the moderator of Session) selected Ragina Isham and Cameron Mayfield to lead a Mission Study with support from the session and deacons. The Mission Study is crucial as JCPC begins the process of discerning what is next in the life of our church. It is our hope that through this intentional discernment process, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, we will have greater clarity on the call and vision of John Calvin Presbyterian Church. The Study will also inform potential Pastoral candidates of who we are, who we want to become, and our vision for the future.

Now that the survey has been completed, we will have a luncheon on August 11th after service in the fellowship hall to discuss the findings of the survey and chart a way forward as a congregation. Please attend if you are able and take part in this crucial next step for our Church.

Session Updates!

The Session would like to extend warm greetings & blessings to our fellow congregants and friends of JCPC. We hope all is well with everyone as we navigate these tough & uncertain times in the life of our Church and Country. We want to ensure you that we are working diligently on your behalf and in service of our Lord, Jesus Christ! Before we get into some of the things that we are currently working on, and those that we plan to embark on in the near future, we want to share this devotional that one of our Session members shared with us.

2 Chronicles 20:20 (GNT): "Put your trust in the Lord your God and you will stand your ground. Believe what his prophets tell you, and you will succeed".

When we focus on the problems instead of trusting God, we're going to end up exhausted and defeated - because God didn't design us to fight our battles alone. We don't have the power we need to face every problem in our own strength. God's the power source. We can't focus on our many problems and focus on God at the same time. When we focus on him, we're standing strong with an attitude of quiet confidence in the character and in the promises of our God.

God doesn't want us to back down from difficult situations. He doesn't want you to sacrifice your integrity. God wants us to trust him through the challenges, and learn from them instead of waving the flag in defeat. Let us stand strong as we rely on his word and the winds of the Holy Spirit as he leads us into our future together. During the months of June and July, the Session, the Deacons, the Committees & Church Staff members have worked on many important and worthwhile endeavors. The deacons hosted a reception for Aaron, Louise, and Asher Ochart in June as the congregation wished them well on their new journey. The deacons have made themselves available to the congregation for any "Pastoral" care needs during this time of transition.

The Worship Committee has successfully supplied us with a wonderful pulpit supply for all of 2024 and possibly into 2025. Starting in August, we will have 2 rotating pulpit supply members (Elder Ford Deith and Rev. Martha Robson) so we can build some familiarity with just 2 individuals going forward. The Outreach Committee served the Program of Hope in June, and is coordinating the rental of our Fellowship Hall for recent graduations & other celebrations. The Outreach Committee is also planning congregational life activities in the upcoming months to facilitate a sense of community with Table Cloth dinners, hymns & beers/Theology on Tap, Pot Luck with the Saints on Sundays, and is actively exploring other opportunities. The Facilities Committee is working hard to coordinate the repairs of the awning & replacement of gutters around the Fellowship Hall and maintenance for the upcoming Playschool year. The Staff Committee worked to hire our new Office Assistant, Briana Mayfield. Briana is helping to keep the "light" on in the office while we work to secure our next permanent Pastor.

Session Updates Cont.

In staff news, Kelly Cuppett, continues to provide us with uplifting music during worship service while the choir is on summer break. The Sundays at Six music series is fully in swing with funding from generous congregation members with an average attendance number of 35-40 people at each event. Briana has recently requested support from the Session to pursue studies as a Commissioned Ruling Elder (CRE) /Commissioned Pastor (CP). Briana will also be leading the Christian Education Committee with many ideas on how to engage the youth and adults this coming fall. Going forward, the Newsletter will feature congregation members so we can learn more about each other. Interested congregation members will fill out a short form with general questions about themselves, and key summary points with a picture of them will be featured in future newsletters.

The Session is currently working on many key actions to stabilize the normal operations of our Church as well as planning for a sustainable ministry future through the kick-off of Mission Study 2024.

The Mission Study Committee leads have outlined and communicated a plan that combines the effort of Project Regeneration that started in November of 2023 along with the recent engagement of the congregation through an anonymous survey and an upcoming luncheon in August where we plan to present the survey results and gather additional feedback.

The Session and the Mission Committee is focusing on the state of our finances. We voted in July to form a new Finance Committee (with 2 new members) that will provide stewardship over both the Church and Playschool finances. We have successfully worked with the Playschool Treasurer to negotiate a new method of how shared direct expenses are paid to the church, and are currently reviewing the Church financial forecast for 2024 and 2025. To address our budget deficit, a multi-year plan of possible income sources will be developed including input from the anonymous survey. This will be no small task to develop & execute as there will be many discussions and difficult decisions ahead. Finally, the Session is beginning its work on selecting our next slate of elders and commencing a crucial Stewardship campaign for 2025.

Let's love and serve the Lord enthusiastically with all of our hearts, souls & minds and with our combined strength, and let's love each other through these tough & uncertain times. Please prayerfully consider volunteering for any of the important activities in the life of our church.
